From Pastor Brian

“The world needs a sense of worth, and it will achieve it only by its people feeling that they are worthwhile.” - Fred (Mister) Rogers

I knew of Mr. Rogers’ Neighborhood as a child, but I only started paying attention as an adult and when I learned he was an ordained Presbyterian Minister, well that was icing on the cake. As I transition out of the role of Associate Pastor for Outreach at Claremont Presbyterian Church and move into the role of Pastor and Head of Staff at All Peoples Presbyterian Church, I have found Mr. Rogers’ words to be a sort of balm for my soul, “The world needs a sense of worth, and it will achieve it only by its people feeling that they are worthwhile.”

My ministry began with believing that meeting people where they are in life, exactly as who they are, and finding value and worth in them was what the Gospel calls us to do. I brought that with me to Claremont Presbyterian Church, and shared it with everyone I met - to the many community organizations, faith groups, commissions, families, schools, and others to whom I was honored to have become a friend and pastor. And now, even more than just the lesson from the Gospels, CPC has shown me that you are truly worthwhile. I hope I played a small part in sharing this message with you all.

At All Peoples PC I will be working with the folks in the congregation to help them build a ministry outward; not unlike what we did at CPC. I have been invited to walk with them around the neighborhood and engage the neighbors in building relationships and friendships, and hopefully some new partnerships. It is their desire and prayer to hear the Spirit whisper in their ears God’s revealing word as to what is next for them in Cathedral City. I

Guest Preacher

The Rev. Wendy Tajima to preach on January 7

As CPC heads into a time of transition in 2024, our San Gabriel Presbytery Executive, The Rev. Wendy Tajima, will be our guest preacher in worship on Sunday, January 7.

Rev. Wendy S. Tajima is a native of Pasadena, and was raised in San Gabriel Presbytery. Her grandfather was an immigrant Japanese pastor. Wendy has always believed that growing up in Pasadena's strong and diverse community has been a great blessing in her life. After graduating from Stanford University, Wendy worked in a social service agency working with battered women and their children. She earned an MBA from UCLA (Anderson) Graduate School of Management, and worked for Apple Computer in multiple management positions for 8 years.

She started seminary, first at Fuller Seminary's Bay Area extension campus, then San Francisco Theological Seminary (SFTS). She was ordained in 1997 and served ecumenically in Hawai'i for 10 years. She came back to California and served as Associate Dean of Enrollment at SFTS, then as Stated Clerk and Associate General Presbyterian for Presbytery of the Pacific. She has been Executive Presbyterian for San Gabriel Presbytery since April 2014, offering support to 39 Presbyterian churches from Eagle Rock to Claremont and Pomona.

- Prioritize leadership needs in the areas of ministry for which Pastor Brian has been responsible
- Compose Job Description for interim leadership staff
- Work with Presbytery to identify potential candidates
- Interview and propose candidate to Session

The team will give periodic updates to the congregation on their progress. We hope to have interim staff in place sometime in the first quarter of 2024.
