CPC Sanctuary Choir to Present Gospel Mass on Easter Sunday

In commemoration of the risen Lord on Easter Sunday, March 31, the CPC Sanctuary Choir is excited to present Robert Ray's *Gospel Mass*.

Although he was a lifelong member of the African Methodist Episcopal Church, composer Robert Ray was influenced greatly by his collaboration with Father Clarence Rivers, the first African American priest in the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. He wrote the *Gospel Mass* in 1979 in an effort he once described as "experimental," but the piece garnered swift critical acclaim. Its six movements are energized by the skillful stylistic combination of jazz, rock, blues, funk and pop, and its harmonies and modulations convey a powerful musical message of both diversity and unity.

Robert Ray passed away in 2022 after a notable career at the University of Illinois-Urbana and later work with the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra. His musical legacy lives on to provide choirs with a uniquely fun and inspirational performance experience.


News from our Deacons

Adult Ed Presents...

What does hope mean to chronically ill children, their families, and their caregivers? How does hope become a communal experience in the depths of suffering?

A soon to be released book by Rev. Dr. Duane R. Bidwell addresses these questions and more. The book's title is lengthy and descriptive: *After the Worst Day Ever: What Sick Kids Know About Sustaining Hope in Chronic Illness.* The research is based on 51 conversations with children who have renal disease or are in need of dialysis or organ transplants. The experiences shared offer encouraging perspectives on cultivating hope.

Members and friends are invited to a conversation with the author, one of CPC's own, on Sunday, March 17 at 8:45 AM (before Worship) in Room 1. Duane is a scholar, minister, and former hospital chaplain who is currently a faculty member of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences. The Path In



At the Center

Pause, taking some time for silence. Remember that you stand with God, surrounded by God's love. Let go of the feelings that have emerged and give them to God.

The Path Out

Lent is a time for service, a time of giving. As you walk, celebrate the ways in which you have been giving and helping. Ask yourself if there are new ways you might be called to contribute to Christ's mission during Lent. Know that Christ walks with you and will bless all that you do.
