...Let us go into the house of the Lord! I am so looking forward to Sunday, June 6 when we will worship together in the Sanctuary in person. Who could have imagined when we suspended in person worship in March 2020 that we would be away from our beautiful sacred space for so long! As we prepare to move forward into June and beyond, here are a few things to keep in mind.

1. The COVID-19 virus is still among us, so we will continue to take appropriate safety precautions as we gather. We are guided in this by recommendations from the CDC and Los Angeles County Department of Public Health. These recommendations are rapidly evolving! We will begin with a fairly cautious approach that may be more restrictive than what these agencies permit. We look forward to relaxing restrictions as time goes by and we feel more comfortable and confident being together. For our current Safety Guidelines, see the related article inside this newsletter.
2. We will continue to offer our worship services via live stream for anyone who would like to participate remotely. We realize that, on any given Sunday, there could be many reasons including health, travel, work commitments, or family circumstances to choose this option. Our worshipping community will now always include both those gathered in the sanctuary and those joining us virtually. The Holy Spirit unites us in one heart, mind, and soul.
3. There is still work to do to prepare for in person worship. For a list of ways to help, see the list included in this newsletter.

What to expect during in person worship

In accordance with guidance from CDC, the Los Angeles County Health Department, and San Gabriel Presbytery, we will observe the following safety precautions as we begin to worship in person. As summer progresses, we hope we will be able to lift some of these restrictions. We will provide any updates in our July Communicator.

When you arrive

- Ushers will check your name off on a copy of the church roster to note your attendance. This is to enable contact tracing in case there is an infection reported. Guests will fill out a card giving contact information.
- There will be signs posted reminding anyone who is feeling unwell to refrain from attending.
- Everyone attending will be asked to wear a mask so that both vaccinated and unvaccinated persons will feel safe.
- Bulletins will be placed on the welcome table in the narthex for you to pick up.
- All those attending will enter the sanctuary through the center aisle.

In the Sanctuary

- Every other pew will be closed to ensure proper social distancing. Usher will ask you to sit at either end of the pew. Households may sit together.
- Hymnals, pew pads and other materials will be removed from the pews. This is to provide a "low touch" environment to prevent the spread of the virus.

During Worship

- Indoor congregational singing is still considered high risk. We will not be singing together until advised that it is safe to do so. Soloists will sing from the chancel observing the recommended 20 foot distance from the congregation.
- Since children are not yet able to be vaccinated, we will not gather the children up front for a Time with the Children. We will work to provide other ways for them to be actively engaged in our worship service.
- We will not pass the offering plates hand to hand. Instead, ushers will monitor giving baskets placed at the entrances and exits to the sanctuary. Online giving is strongly encouraged.
- Communion: We have ordered supplies of pre-sealed communion elements. We will not pass communion trays; instead, we will have these elements available in your pew.

After worship

- Everyone leaving the sanctuary will be asked to do so via the side aisles and side doors.
- Eating in large group settings is still considered high risk. We will be enjoying

“Coffee-less Coffee Hour” for the time being. There will still be tables set up so that we can visit and enjoy one another’s company, observing recommended social distancing. There will continue to be an online coffee hour for those who join us remotely.

As we gather for our second in person worship on Sunday, June 13 we invite the congregation of CPC to continue to support Inland Valley Hope Partners with a personal hygiene/cleaning supply drive.

Any personal hygiene or cleaning products of any size (travel, personal, or family) are welcome. Small items will be packaged into individual hygiene bags to offer to the unhoused. All other items will be available to support regular clients of IVHP which is still experiencing a significant increase in need over past years.

Suggested items for donation* include soap, shampoo, lotion, toothpaste, deodorant, shaving cream, hand sanitizer, lip balm, along with razors, toilet paper, Kleenex, tampons, toothbrushes, dental floss, combs, hair brushes, Band-Aides, etc. Also welcome are basic cleaning supplies such as dish soap, laundry detergent, dishwashing detergent, window


