The Church Has Left the Building, Part 2

Greetings, friends, as our church community continues to bear witness to the compassion and mercy of God during these difficult times.

On July 16, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health updated its protocols for places of worship. Due to the surge of new infections in our region, “the State Public Health Officer Order... requires the closure of all indoor operations by Places of Worship. Indoor operations at places of worship are closed to the public. Public activities, including services, weddings and funerals, may continue to be conducted outdoors on the grounds of places of worship in compliance with this revised protocol or virtually, using the site or other location as setting.”

At our Session meeting on July 22, the Session voted that we would continue to be in compliance with State and County Health Department directives. Therefore, there will continue to be no indoor worship or other activities on our campus until further notice. The congregations who worship here may plan outdoor services on campus as long as they are in compliance with local health directives. In addition, no activities on our campus will serve food. The new Health Department orders for faith communities do not impact our Children’s Center which operates under separate protocols for Childcare services.

While it is disappointing to have to delay a return to our sanctuary—perhaps for several more months—we are confident that this is the most faithful response our congregation can make in this moment. We want our church to be aligning itself with efforts to reduce the impact and the duration of this pandemic.

In the meantime, our many ministries continue! We worship daily with Morning and Evening Prayer. Sunday morning worship is streamed live through

Claremont Presbyterian Children’s Center Reopens

On July 1, Claremont Presbyterian Children’s Center (CPCC) welcomed children into their classrooms for the first time since March 13. Because of the strict protocols for child care centers operating during the COVID-19 pandemic, many things were different:

- Parents drop off their children at the building door, but cannot come inside.
- Each child has their temperature taken before entering the classroom for the day.
- Teachers all wear masks and aprons which they change frequently.
- Classrooms are self-contained and can have no more than 10 children.
- Teachers no longer serve snacks.
- Classes are encouraged to spend as much time out of doors as possible.

Yet we are also thankful that many things were just the same:

- The teachers welcome each child with enthusiasm.
- Families are grateful to have quality child care that is attentive to the safety of all.
- Each child is cherished and nurtured by a well prepared teaching staff.
- The CPCC Director, Sacha Lord, is committed to creating a community of care and compassion for all of our CPCC families.

The entire childcare industry has been hit very hard by the COVID-19 crisis and our Center is no exception. The coming months will find CPCC rebuilding its enrollment and recovering its footing financially. During this time of transition, CPCC would welcome your support. If this ministry of our church is close to your heart, consider a gift to sustain our Children’s Center as it returns to providing this service that is vital to the economic and social recovery of our whole community.

Service for Healing and Wholeness

For our August 9 Service for Healing and Wholeness, we will gather outdoors at 7:00 PM in Angel Courtyard. Please bring your own lawn chair if possible. We will pray for our nation and for those known to us who are in need of God’s healing love and strength. We will also stream the service to Facebook Live for those who prefer to worship from home.

Evening Prayer on the Lawn

As the COVID-19 crisis continues, large indoor gatherings are still the focus of concern for transmitting the virus. However, the Los Angeles County Department of Public Health has encouraged faith communities to consider outdoor gatherings as a safer alternative.

With this in mind, we are planning to hold Evening Prayer on the Lawn each Saturday evening at 7 PM throughout August. These services will include prayer, scripture, reflections, and music. Participants may bring a lawn chair and sit on the lawn in front of the sanctuary, or listen from their cars parked in adjacent parking areas. We will ask everyone to observe safe distancing and for those gathering on the lawn to wear a mask.

Our Sunday morning worship services will continue at 10 AM on Facebook Live.

Wednesday Bible Study

Our Wednesday afternoon Bible Study (4:00 PM) will continue in August. Our current study is “Adventures with Paul.” This study coordinates with our July/August sermon series, “What Paul Saw” and follows Paul as he travels throughout the ancient Middle East planting and corresponding with new Christian communities. Delight Slotemaker de Bruine to serve as Parish Care Coordinator

At its meeting on August 22, Session voted on an enthusiastic recommendation from our Personnel Committee for Delight Slotemaker de Bruine to serve as Parish Care Coordinator for Claremont Presbyterian Church.

At the end of 2019, Kristi Van Nostran stepped down as our Parish Intern in order to focus on her work with San Gabriel Presbytery. At that time, Personnel agreed that this position should continue and that it could be filled by a Pastor/Seminarian as it has been in the past—or by someone who is not clergy but who has gifts for compassionate care, strong organization skills, and a lively and contagious faith.

In Delight, we have someone who knows CPC very well, who has served as both an Elder and a Deacon, and who “delights” in caring for others and equipping others for service. Like previous Parish Associates/Interns, her work will focus on providing staff support for our deacons, and assisting our pastors with parish calling and visitation. She will work 8-10 hours/week and will begin on August 1.

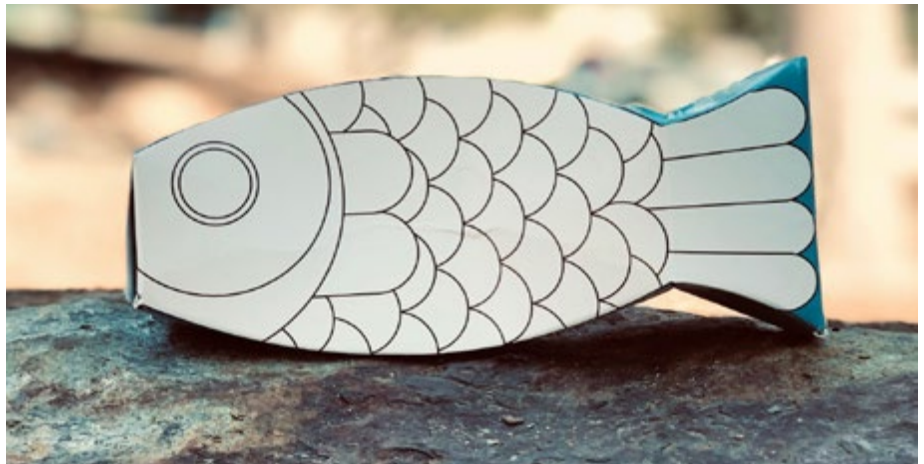
