Calling all singers!

The CPC Sanctuary Choir is beginning preparations for this year's Advent/Christmas major presentation, "A Midnight Clear" by John Leavitt. This major work will be presented in worship on Sunday, December 17.

John Leavitt is acknowledged as one of America's leading contemporary composers and arrangers of choral music, as his works have been performed in over thirty countries. He has written commissioned works for such organizations as the National Endowment for the Arts, and has received annual recognition for excellence from the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers (ASCAP). "A Midnight Clear" is a collection of nine exceptional choral arrangements reflecting both traditional carols and Leavitt's own original work.

The choir rehearses in the Music Building every Thursday night from 7:00 to 8:30 PM. You are invited to attend the entire rehearsal, or join us at around 8:00 as we focus on the Advent selections. In November our rehearsal time will expand to 7:00-9:00 PM as the presentation draws closer.

This is a great opportunity for all who would like to sing in a choir, but whose time commitments otherwise prevent regular attendance at rehearsals.

No previous choral experience is necessary! So please join us Thursday evenings in the Music Building, as we prepare to celebrate the birth of Jesus through song. We look forward to seeing you!

Stewardship FAQs

Where do funds for CPC's operating expenses come from? They come from US! Close to 85% of the income that funds our congregation's operating budget comes from pledges and other offerings. Without your generous pledges, we cannot sustain our ministries.

Why pledge? Can't I just give as I am able? On a personal level, making a pledge is important because it makes generosity a spiritual discipline; a commitment that centers your life.

On a practical level, pledges enable our church leadership to plan. Pledges committed for the coming year form the basis for our annual operating budget. Pledges help our staff and lay leaders move ahead with confidence, knowing funds are committed to sustain their work.

How does our church manage its finances? The Session adopts an annual budget in January and presents it to the congregation. The Property and Finance Commission oversees the church's income and expenditures with the assistance of the church's Treasurer and our Administrative Assistant for Finance. Our financial records are reviewed annually by an independent auditing firm.

What about reserves and endowment funds? The generosity of our members and friends in previous years has given our church both reserves and endowment funds. These are primarily used to fund large capital expenses or major ministry initiatives that fall beyond the scope of our annual operating budget. They may be used to make up shortfalls in the budget with the approval of Session and, in certain cases, a congregational vote. Remembering the church in your estate planning is another way to support our ministries.

Advent at the Abbey

Take a few days to slow down, listen inwardly, and savor quiet during CPC's contemplative Advent retreat **December 11-13** at Saint Andrew's Abbey in Valyermo.

We'll join the rhythms of the monastery, experience

Benedictine spirituality, and savor winter in the high desert from 3 PM Monday through lunch Wednesday.

Duane Bidwell will facilitate our time, which will focus on contemplative practice and the fundamentals of Benedictine spirituality.

There will be plenty of time to rest, walk, and participate in community worship if you'd like. (The monks pray together five times a day, chanting the psalms, reading scripture, and sitting in silence.) All activities are optional.

Know that the monastery community observes Grand Silence—that is, little to no talking, no media, and so forth—after the last prayer of the night until after breakfast the following morning.

Rooms are simple but comfortable, with a bed, a nightstand, a desk, a rocking chair, a private bath, and a private patio.

Cost is \$200 per person which includes two nights lodging and all meals. Scholarship assistance available. To register please call the church office or speak to Pastor Karen or Pastor Brian.
